- The specified trash bags must be placed at curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the scheduled collection day but not before 6:00 p.m. the prior day.

Recyclables Collection

1. Curbside recycling collection is provided twice per month. All recyclables must be placed in a container labeled "Recyclables" Stickers are provided at DPW. Contact DPW for schedule.

2. Acceptable Co-mingles: Rigid plastics with symbols through on the bottom, glass bottles and jars, aluminum cans and foils. (Caps and lids do not have to be removed.) All containers (jars, bottles, cartons, etc.) must be rinsed and free of contaminants. Plastic bags and Styrofoam are not accepted.

3. Acceptable Mixed Paper (must be in separate container): Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, paper bags, phone books, junk mail, inserts, printer paper, etc. Thin cardboard such as cereal boxes, pasta boxes, frozen food boxes, and soda or beer packaging are also acceptable. Corrugated cardboard is acceptable and should be cut and flattened.

Don't Put These in your Bins

Trash, plastic bags, Pizza boxes, light bulbs, metal, plastic wrap, fertilizer bags, dishes/ceramics, toys, clothes, window glass, electronics, wiring, rubber, shoes, yard waste, soiled paper, styrofoam, wood, coat hangers, motor oil cans, plastic plant pots, mops, wax cartons, packed peanuts, ceiling six packs, paper towels, anything with food still in it



Town of Stoughton Solid Waste Program



To the residents of Stoughton,

Enclosed please find a summary of services and rates for the Town's responsible management of your household trash, recyclables, bulk items, scrap metal, and household hazardous waste.

The pick-up schedule throughout town has not been changed. The annual rate for management of your household trash and recyclables for single family homes has decreased. The rates for multi-family dwellings have slightly increased. However, your curbside trash must now be bagged in either an 8, 15 or 33-gallon bag that can be purchased at several local retailers (list attached herein). Bulk items can be scheduled for pickup by calling DPW. Residents will now be quoted a price for bulk items (also attached). Payment for such items shall be made by credit card or online at www.stoughton.org.

In order to preserve the beauty of our Town and prevent incidents of illegal dumping, a trash inspector will travel around Town daily to provide guidance and ensure compliance with the Town's Solid Waste program. The inspector will work closely with the Stoughton Police Department to

Recolha de Recicláveis

1. A recolha de recicláveis é fornecida duas vezes por mês. Todo o lixo a reciclar deve ser colocado num recipiente com a etiqueta "Recyclables". Etiquetas fornecidas no DPW. Contactar o DPW para marcação.
2. Combinacões Aceites: Plásticos rígidos com os símbolos a no fundo, garrafas e frascos de vidro, latas e folhas de alumínio. (Tapas e tampas não precisam ser removidas) Todos os recipientes (frascos, garrafas, caixas, etc.) devem ser exagudados e livre de contaminantes. Sacos plásticos e esferovite não são aceites.
3. Papel Misto Aceite (em recipiente separado): jornais, revistas, catálogos, sacos de papel, listas telefónicas, correspondência de propaganda, inserções, papel de cópia, etc. Cartão fino como caixas de cereais, de massas, de comida congelada; embalagens de sumos e cervejas também são aceites. Papelão ondulado é aceite e deve ser cortado e achatado.

Não Colocar no Seu Receptáculo

Lixo, sacos plásticos, caixas de pizza, lâmpadas, metal, filme plástico, sacos de fertilizante, loiça/cerâmicas, brinquedos, roupa, vidro de janela, eletrónicos, fios, borracha, sapatos, resíduos de quintal, papel sujo, esferovite, madeira, cabides, recipientes de óleo de motor, vasos plásticos, esfregonas, caixas de cera, amendoins embalados, das plástico das embalagens de seis, toalhas de papel, qualquer recipiente com restos de comida.

Aos residents de Stoughton,

Em anexo por favor encontre o resumo dos serviços e taxas a cobrar pela responsabilidade do Town em administrar o seu lixo doméstico, recicláveis, grandes volumes, ferro velho e lixo doméstico perigoso.

Os horários de recolha do Town inteiro não sofreram alterações. A taxa anual para administração do seu lixo doméstico e recicláveis, para casas unifamiliares, diminuirá, para casas com mais que uma família aumentaram ligeiramente. Contudo, para que o seu lixo doméstico seja recolhido, este terá de ser ensacado em sacos de 8, 15 ou 33 galões disponíveis para compra em vários pontos de venda (lista anexa). A recolha de grandes volumes pode ser agendada por telefone para o DPW.

Residentes têm agora uma taxa a pagar pelo serviço de recolha de grandes volumes (lista anexa). Estes pagamentos serão feitos por cartão de crédito ou online em www.stoughton.org.

Para preservar a beleza do nosso Town e evitar incidentes de despejo ilegal de lixo, o Inspetor do lixo vai precorrer o Town diariamente oferecendo orientação e assegurando o cumprimento do Programa de Lixo do Town. O Inspector vai trabalhar com o Police Department na investigação de tais incidentes.

6/15/2023 Stoughton Solid Waste Meeting Q and A review:

Could a program like we are proposing right now lead to layoffs?

No, there are no budgeted, planned, or anticipated layoffs. On the contrary if we do not do a program like this it will affect services and our ability to continue to support the program and labor. It is by doing this program that we will get to avoid any conversation of layoffs but let me be clear and direct, there will be no layoffs.

Is there any effort to move toward privatization of the trash?

Absolutely not. There will be no privatization.

How does our fee compare with surrounding communities?

Currently we are lower by \$117 annually. With this program that will decrease even lower by an additional \$24 annually.

Why is there a need to increase fees at all?

The Town has been running a structural deficit in solid waste for years. It is projected to go to \$855,000 this budget year. The future looks worse as disposal costs are exploding regionally. We believe it is important to pay the solid waste bill from fees - as originally designed. We have also been told by Moody's that to do otherwise is bad practice.

Why are we considering the PAYT (Pay As You Throw) fee structure?

We need to close the deficit. PAYT is a fee structure that creates savings for the town. That savings is passed back to residents. PAYT costs residents less (\$344 on average). It provides more control of costs and a fairer system. The flat fee structure keeps operating costs higher for the town and passes those high costs on to residents (\$391 on average). We believe PAYT is the most efficient system to keep costs down for residents.

Other than reducing costs, are there other benefits to PAYT?

Yes, we will keep our streets cleaner. We will make huge strides environmentally and be eligible for more grant funding through MASS DEP.

Why would we implement a system that is so different and new?

The PAYT system has been around for over 30 years and is utilized in over 500 communities across the country. You do not want to pay for your neighbor's trash. Just like with water, sewer, gas and electricity- you have control over how much you pay and utilize these services.

How will the rates change and how will we be impacted?

Flat Fee will go down from \$254 to \$230, for Seniors it will go down from \$190.52 to \$115

Bags will cost \$2 for 33 gallons, \$1.25 for 15 gallons and \$.90 for 8 gallons

Bulky charges are posted online

How will this impact seniors?

The plan has three implications for seniors.

1) The flat fee for seniors will be discounted from \$190.52 to \$115 per year.

2) Seniors tend to produce less trash and we will be offering an 8-gallon bag at .90 cents/bag for low volume users. This is an opportunity for seniors to reduce their costs from where they are today

3) The current system where the shortfall is subsidized by the taxes disproportionately hurts seniors and this need to subsidize will be eliminated with this proposal.

Does our recycling actually get recycled?

Yes, we have confirmed that things are being recycled with a new vendor in Avon, inspected the facility and are confident it will be recycled per agreement.

Will residents be able to throw everything recyclable into one container?

Yes, it is a “single stream” system.

Has the Avon recycling contract been executed?

Execution is coming in the next few days, it will be more convenient for residents, save the town money and help us manage our fleet more effectively.

Is there any evidence from other towns that illegal dumping transpires?

Based on interviews and data provided by DEP, EPA and municipalities that have PAYT programs they all confirm that it not an issue and in fact some towns report illegal dumping decreases.

Code enforcement officer – will he be working on the trucks riding shot gun? Are they going to invoke the police?

Yes. Illegal dumping is a crime today and is sighted as such, so it is already a police issue, and they will be working with the Code Officer. Our goal, however, is to use the first 90 days (3 months) to educate residents as much as possible so that this issue is minimal and manageable. Public education ensures that residents know how to properly dispose or recycle their items.

What about people from outside Stoughton who use our town as a dump?

We believe it is a significant problem and a cost for today. This program and the enforcement plan will put an end to it.

There seems to be significantly more trash in front of 2 and 3 family homes, how can this be addressed?

PAYT addresses this issue completely. Most of the trash appears to be bulky items from tenants from other buildings where they are not paying any Town solid waste fee. The new system will eliminate this practice. The current proposal increases fees for multi-family dwellings. The Town does not collect any households with more than three (3) units.

Why have we waited so long to raise rates?

We have kicked the can down the road, sometimes, like with covid, for very valid reasons. We cannot continue to do so. Trash costs are only going up. Please see SMAC presentation for more information on the waste crisis in New England.

Back in 2010 we signed 20-year contract with SEMASS, that would run until 2030 so how does all this affect that contract?

It does not. As our recycling numbers go up our trash minimum goes down. There are a variety of other protections including the marketplace and state regulations.

If we go to a bag system, PAYT, will you still be able to throw the bag in trash barrel?

Yes, we would encourage that to keep pests out of the trash.

Where will I be able to purchase bags?

Bags will be available from a variety of retailers, throughout the Town. A full list will be provided to residents once all retailers are confirmed.

Am I required to participate?

No. You can opt out if you can show a contract with a private solid waste collector.

Do stores get a mark-up?

No. They do this throughout the state as part of their commitment to customers and the environment.

How will this create savings?

Tipping fees, per ton of garbage disposed, are a huge part of our budget. The changes we are proposing will reduce that line item by 40-50% and we are passing those savings back to the residents in the PAYT fee structure. This will result in a lower sanitation budget and the savings should be passed on to the residents.

Some residents and DPW personnel feel comfortable handling bulky waste and construction and demolition debris, why do we need to change?

Three reasons. 1) It is considered a safety issue to handle these items as we are doing it today 2) Many of the materials on the curb are banned from residential waste collection by MASS DEP. 3) These residents and non-residents who do not pay for the service to dispose of their items are our curb at our expense. For these reasons, we are one of the few towns left in the Commonwealth that do not have separate fee-based pick-up for bulky items.

Will the town be looking in my bag?

No. We will not open the bags.

Do we anticipate more recycling pick up since we will have more recycling?

We anticipate more volume so we will add another route.

How will home bound residents have access to bags?

They will have the same access they have now, however they get bags at a retail outlet. Bags will also be made available at the senior center and an online option that would include a delivery fee can be made available.

Could we reduce the base fee?

Yes. This program will reduce it.

Is the town looking at other ways to reduce waste?

There are many ways to keep materials out of the waste stream and the Town intends to develop and increase those options as they become available. This will all be part of the 90-day education roll-out.

Will Seniors who qualify for the discount but have realty trusts be eligible for the discount?

Yes

How is this being communicated today and as the program rolls out?

The meeting has been broadcast on SMAC multiple times a day, shared on the Town Manager's Facebook, notification on the Town website and notice about the meetings have been posted. In the 90-day roll out period, we will be utilizing social media, town newsletters, press releases, and community outreach and education.

In effort to move towards more environmentally friendly ways of disposing of trash and recycling, are we aware of any correlation to reducing PFAS in our water supply?

No, this should have an impact on PFAS. Keeping waste contained out of the water supply is always the best practice.

What if, as a Town, we don't like this?

As an individual you can opt out of the Town's solid waste program and get a private hauler (with documentation). As a Town we can come up with a new way to deal with the system at Town Meeting.

Is there any financial assistance available to those who may consider the purchase of bags a financial hardship?

Yes. There are significant resources available from the state for seniors and those residents with disabilities. That financial aid may be accessed through a licensed social worker. She will assist residents in making the application and following up on funding. Further, the motion proposed to Select Board provides for the Town Manager to consider financial aid for any resident who is unable to afford the purchase of more than one bag week.

All of our programs are at the Stoughton Public Library - except Arts in the Park programs which are presented at the South School located at 171 Ash St in Stoughton, and storytimes at Halloran Park, located on Pierce St in Stoughton.

- Program Guidelines -

Children participating should be in sixth grade or below.

The minutes a child reads will be entered into Beanstack, an online reading log accessible from the library website, which will allow participants to read and complete challenges to earn raffle tickets for prizes.

Pre-schoolers may have books read to them. If older siblings read to younger family members, the minutes read may be counted by both of them. Books which are read for school can be counted both for the school and the public library summer reading program.

For students in the Stoughton schools who participate via Beanstack, we will share their name and grade with the School system to let them know they participated in the Summer Reading Program.




