In 2021, the conservation commission never had the meeting brought up because the LLC (owner of the land) failed to fill out the mandatory paperwork.

The Prospect Street residents did not know of any public hearing for the project.

The advertising of this New Public hearing on 10/27/22 was not in the Suburban Shopper for people to get. There was no notification to residents for the alleged public hearing held earlier in the year. This adds to our questions about lack of transparency for the neighborhood.

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I also want to share my thoughts on the actual location of the fire department.

A few years ago, a large section of downtown burnt down.

The town could have bought that section and rebuilt it for the offices and meeting rooms.

Then the original fire station could have been refurbished just for fire house purposes.

As far as cost go, there would have been a major reduction in financial planning.

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As of what I understand, the land on Park St where Line Lumber was, was one of the selections to relocate the Fire Station project. It was rejected because the land is to be used for educational use. Now I would like to share my “what if options” with the Town.

Could the Town make this an educational facility for future Emergency Medical technicians and future firefighters? It would be our Fire Station location, and at the same time be a “hands on” training facility.

I predict that this vocation is a growing field. It could bring in income to the Town and allow the Town to get grants.
